# Pastor Dave's Reflections

*God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Psalm 46:1*

It is difficult to realize that the month of September is almost over as I am trying to gather some thoughts as we find ourselves on the brink of the season of change known as Fall. The warm days and summer opportunities have already begun to fade. As fall continues to unfold we will notice the changing colors of leaves, the cooler temperatures, the harvest of fields, the sports transitions, and the lineup of church harvest festivals and dinners.

Along with these anticipated transitions we also experience many different kinds of trouble and difficulty. The news is filled with many reports of these troubles every day. There are times it seems as though while one or two difficulties are resolved more line up to take their place. The church in its broadest understanding is not immune. In fact some of the difficulties and troubles the church wrestles with on a fairly regular basis have been brewing and festering for hundreds of years.

At the end of October, the 31st to be exact, while we most often think of the date as Halloween, it is also known as Reformation Day, a day the church is challenged to look at itself and how faith and faith practice needs to be examined and where necessary allow adjustments to be made. As you may or may not be aware October 31, 2017 will mark the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Over the course of the next year many different church bodies will be celebrating not just what was, but the ongoing reformation process within and between church bodies.

At the recent churchwide assembly held in New Orleans I was impressed and moved by the actions taken with respect to what is and will be unfolding. Below I have inserted part of the summary of the actions taken. Among the most notable are the Declaration on the Way, a decades long process of redressing hurts of the Reformation and paving the way to, as it says, "greater unity between Catholics and Lutherans."

Equally impressive is the ELCA's AAMPARO (Accompany Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities) strategy designed to put into practice the ministry of hospitality as work is done among and with migrant minors.

The summary below is by no means comprehensive. On the ELCA website there is a complete summary of actions that were taken each day, video clips of events and conversations had at the assembly, and updates as to how the actions taken may end up finding expression in our individual congregational constitutions, such as the newly approved Ministry of Word and Service Roster. How these changes will be worded and incorporated will be explained as we draw closer to annual meetings.

In the face of the changes the challenges, troubles and difficulties have impacted our lives with, the opening verse of the Psalm 46 printed above is a reminder of the strength and hope God keeps front and center as we live out our days. It was because of this assurance that Martin Luther wrote the hymn "A Mighty Fortress." With God as our refuge and strength may we continue living into the faith relationship God has marked our lives with.

This summary is part of the summary of actions from the ELCA website.

The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the church, is a process of communal spiritual discernment. Voting members of the 2016 Churchwide Assembly took the following actions:

- Elected William B. Horne II as vice president of the ELCA. Horne, of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Clearwater, Fla., will begin his six-year term on Nov. 1.
- Approved the Declaration on the Way, a unique ecumenical document that marks a path toward greater unity between Catholics and Lutherans.
- Approved AAMPARO, the ELCA's strategy to Accompany Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities.
- Approved the Ministry of Word and Service roster. Beginning Jan. 1, 2017, ELCA associates in ministry, deaconesses and diaconal ministers will be a single, unified roster of Ministry of Word and Service.
- Approved the accompanying constitutional amendments related to the Ministry of Word and Service roster.
- Adopted budget proposals for 2017 – 2019.

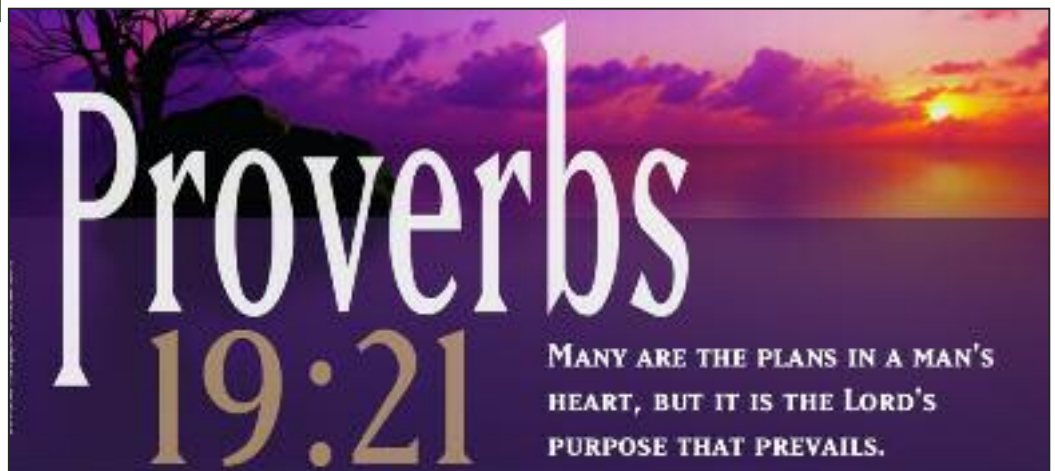

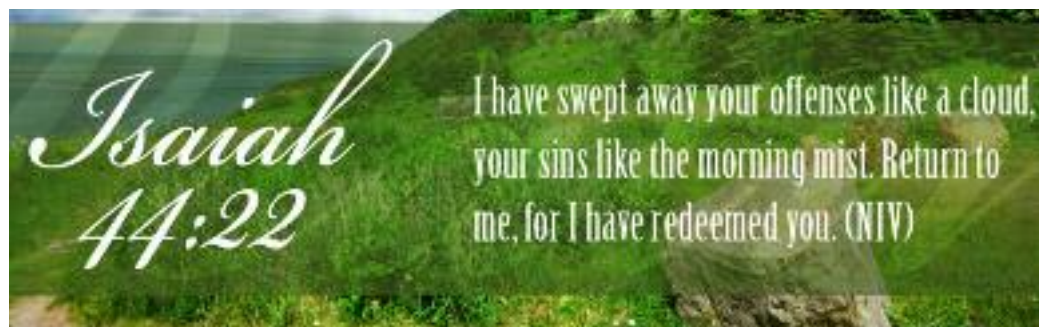

- No shrubbery shall be allowed.
  - All family decorations are at the family's own risk and will be removed at the next mowing.
  - All foot markers to be set at grass level to preclude equipment damage.
  - It shall be the duty of the Sextons to enter upon any lot or grave to prohibit, modify or remove and dispose of any structure or object which may have been placed there in violation of any of the rules and regulations submitted, or which may be considered in their judgment to be unsightly, dangerous, or objectionable or interferes with the cemetery operations.
  - Family shall be responsible for the cost of snow removal in the case of winter burials.
  - The cemetery board reserves the right to change these rules or to make such other rules as they deem necessary for the operation of the cemetery. No notice of such intended changes shall be required.
